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OPPONG NKRUMAH LEADS JOURNALISTS TO DONATE BLOOD



The Minister for Information, Honourable Kojo Oppong Nkrumah has led about 100 persons including journalists in the Ministry's press pool and staff of the Ministry and Information Service Department (ISD) to donate blood to compliment stocks at the National Blood Bank.

Five weeks ago, the Ghana National Blood Service had indicated during one of the Minister's press briefings that it needed more people to support the blood bank since it was running out of blood to save lives.

This, they explained was as a result of restrictions on social distancing occasioned by the pandemic which affected mass blood donation across the country.

The Ministry responded by throwing the challenge to members of the press pool and staff of the Ministry to help fix the problem together.

Five weeks on, about 100 volunteers, journalists, staff and members of the general public inclusive came in their numbers to participate in the donation exercise.

The Minister who was excited at the turn out of the exercise thanked volunteers for their kind gesture in helping refill the bank saying the exercise is worth emulating by corporate institutions.

He said the success of the exercise showed how much we can achieve if we bring our hands on deck.

At the end of the exercise, the National Blood Bank recorded 78 pints of blood.



MINISTRY OF INFORMATION MOBILIZES SUPPORT FOR THE MEDIA

The Ministry of Information together with its development partners and private sector players have commenced efforts at providing support for the media in Ghana.

According to the Minister for Information, Honourable Kojo Oppong Nkrumah, just like other estates of the realm that genuinely deserved investments to improve its quality of output, so too does the media require relevant, timely, sustained investment to improve the quality of its output.

He made these remarks at the Development Partner's Conference on Media Support Programmes today at the Alisa Hotel.

"Ghana has built for itself a robust culture of independent, free and fierce media practice since before independence. Despite the occasional sporadic incidents of media attacks and the complains about media misreportage by various segments of the society, Ghana's media landscape continues to generally be the toast and envy of many globally. But media practice has significant challenges", the Minister remarked.

He mentioned that though Ghana was now nearing the completion of research work to collate empirically the most recent challenges of the media, a cursory analysis already highlighted a number of challenges that must be urgently attended to. Wikipedia's narrative about media in Ghana among other things indicated that in spite of its relative freedom, the media in Ghana did face some challenges. Journalists in Ghana were often poorly paid, under resourced, and often lacked training. As a result, journalists in Ghana found themselves susceptible to many undesirable practices affecting the quality and altruistic nature of the work they are believed to be doing.

The Minister indicated that the establishment of the Media Capacity and Enhancement Programme (MCEP) as well as the Coordinated Mechanism for the Safety of Journalists (CMSJ) are some measures to address the myriad of challenges faced by the media in Ghana.

While the MCEP is designed to create a framework within which academia and practitioners developed and executed training programmes for practicing producers, journalists, and editors to enhance their capacity to deliver on their mandate, the CMSJ under the National Media Commission (NMC) is designed to continuously promote and ensure the maintenance of free robust environment for journalism practice.

This was in addition to the logistics and monetary support government had made available to the media as a support mechanism to help them in their day-to-day administration.

The conference was organised by the Ministry of Information and was attended by the United States

Ambassador to Ghana, Stephanie Sanders Sullivan, Chairperson of the Parliamentary Select Committee on Communications, Hon. Cynthia Morrison, Chairman of the National Media Commission (NMC), Mr. Yaw Boadu Ayeboafo, President of the Ghana Journalists Association (GJA), Roland Affail Monney, Executive Director of the Media Foundation for West Africa (MFWA) Sulemana Braimah, Rector of the Ghana Institute of Journalism (GIJ), Prof. Kwamena Kwansah-Aidoo and Representatives from the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO), United States Agency for International Development (USAID), Private Newspaper Publishers Association of Ghana (PRINPAG), Ghana Independent Broadcasters Association (GIBA) and private sector players.

The Chairperson of the NMC, Mr. Ayeboafo underscored the relevance of coordination as sector players to provide the necessary platforms and personnel training in order for the media to thrive. He said that the country's media needed support in order to become relevant actors in society.

MEDIA CAPACITY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMME

The Media Capacity Enhancement Programme was established to address the capacity challenges of the media to position it to play its role effectively as the fourth estate in our governance system. The programme is in line with one of the key strategic objectives of the Ministry to improve the media's participation national development. When fully rolled out, the programme will see to the periodic training of journalists across the country in order to enhance their journalistic skills.

COORDINATED MECHANISM FOR THE SAFETY OF JOURNALISTS (CMSJ)

Through the CMSJ, the Ministry has collaborated with the NMC to inaugurate the Office of the Coordinated Mechanism on the Safety of Journalists in May 2021. Key to the operation of this office is the development of a framework for use by all stakeholders and an online application system to create a safe and conducive environment for the practice of journalism; prevent violence against journalists; protect journalists in danger; and prosecute perpetrators.

INFO MINISTER SWEARS IN NEW GPCL BOARD...CHARGES THEM TO CONSOLIDATE GAINS

The Minister for Information, Honourable Kojo Oppong a way of keeping in tune with consumer demands. Nkrumah has sworn in seven new Board Members of the Ghana Publishing Company Limited (GPCL).

At a brief ceremony at the Ministry of Information, the Minister tasked the new Board Members to consolidate the gains the company had made in the last four years to strategically position it as the spearhead of the publishing industry in Ghana.

"As you start this new tenure, one of the first things I will like you to do is to work hard to consolidate the gains that have been achieved so far in the first term. We must build on the kind of transformation that was started. Particularly, we must improve on the volumes of business that the organization is doing and the financial returns that it is bringing. We need to focus on the efficiency programmes that have been introduced so that we can build higher height on it," he stressed.

The GPCL in the last few years had undergone structural transformation. The company that was previously challenged and could not fully execute its printing and publishing mandate had been revamped and retooled as the principal state printing and publishing institution solely responsible for printing and publishing government works.

The Minister was optimistic at the prospects of the publishing company and challenged the newly reconstituted Board Members to continue this path of progress and as well ensure strong corporate governance to guide and promote sound governance and institutional performance.

According to him, the only way GPCL could function properly was for the company to take to digitization as

a way of keeping in tune with consumer demands. He encouraged the new Board Members to infuse best practices in the publishing industry into the management of the publishing company to make it one of the profitable State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) in the country.

The re-appointed Board Chairman, Dr. Daniel Owusu-Ansah in his response registered their appreciation to the President for appointing them. He indicated that during their first term, they managed to print, publish and distribute but are ready to transcend the bar they have set.

"We fully commit ourselves to what the Minister has said, especially, regarding digitalization of the place (GPC), modernization, introduction of modern publishing practices and we are very hopeful that this time round, we will not just be counted, but of course, we will like to be very great in the sub-region, that we will become a reference point for printing and publishing in our part of the world."

The Board is chaired by Dr. Daniel Owusu-Ansah with Mr. David Boateng Asante, Hon. Paul Twum-Barimah, Dr. Kingsley Nyarko, Madam Lawuratu Musah-Saaka, Mrs. Beatrice Barwuah and Isaac Kofi Appiah as members.

SIGA PROS SENSITIZED AND ONBOARDED ONTO BONSU PR REPORTING PLATFORM

Government has initiated a move to onboard all Public Relations Officers (PROs) of the various State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) unto the "Bonsu" reporting platform by October 15th 2021.

The platform is a real-time information and reporting interface which allows all PROs to share their planned activities to enhance effective planning and management of Government communications by the Ministry of Information.

This initiative is part of effort to improve the coordination role of the Public Relations Coordinating Division of the Information Services Department in a bid to harmonise Government communications' effort.

The Director-General of SIGA, Mr. Stephen Asamoah-Boateng in his opening remarks reaffirmed the importance of communication in any business and the need to enhance the role of PROs.

"Communication is a powerful tool. It is the first human development we encountered when nature brought us together. Communication is a way to develop economically. One of the first responsibilities of state institutions is to engage its citizens. If you do not share your success stories, nobody will know what you are doing," he said.

Mr. Asamoah Boateng however, bemoaned the fact that some Chief

Executive Officers do not involve their communication directors in their meetings when discussing strategic plans for their institutions thereby reducing the PR officers role to become reactive. He assured that he will use his office to ensure the inclusion of PR officers in strategic meetings.

The Minister for Information, Honourable Kojo Oppong Nkrumah expressed concern about one of the afro barometer report by the Centre for Democratic Development (CDD) indicating that the Government of Ghana did not work for the people of Ghana. He described the assertion as dangerous for Ghana's democracy.

"Some challenges such as distrust in public institutions, media pluralism, misinformation and disinformation and the constant interference of opposition and Civil Service Organisations existential interest that undermines government's work accounts for the assertion from the report," he noted.

According to the Minister, to change this bad perception, there was the need for state institutions to collaborate with each other, using social media to amplify their success because agenda setting is critical in changing the narrative.

He added that the initiative was not to render the Public Relations Officers of SOE's inactive but strengthen their PR efforts by highlighting their success stories to reach a wider audience with MOI and ISD machinery.

Madam Oboshie Sai-Coffie, Government Communication Advisor, in her remarks advised PROs to take advantage of modern technology to tell stories about their institutions.
